Reading Support/Literacy

Exceptional Children Program

Provides individualized services to students in the classroom or small group setting based on Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

AIG Program/Discovery Program

AIG Program provides consultative services for academically gifted grade 3-5 students. The Discovery Program provides enrichment services for K-2 students.
